God's Word, the Bible, is our handbook for living. Jesus Himself said that we need God's Word to really live. As a newborn believer, you may know very little about the Bible or how to use it. This sheet has been designed to provide basic knowledge of the Bible as well as tips that will assist you in studying and using your Bible effectively.

## WHAT IS THE BIBLE?

The Bible is the inspired, infallible, authoritative and inerrant Word of God. It traces the history of man from creation, to the fall and finally to God's wonderful promise of redemption. The Bible reveals God's continual loving care and working in, with and through the lives of ordinary men and women. All we need to know about God, man and salvation are contained within the Bible. God chooses to speak to us through His word, the Bible. In short, the Bible is God's love letter to us.

## WHERE DID THE BIBLE COME FROM?

Throughout history, God used His Holy Spirit to inspire godly men to write His Word. The Bible, however, is much more than words of men. God's Spirit worked in these men's minds and hearts to record how and what He wanted to communicate to us. God has faithfully protected His Word throughout the ages so that what we know today, as the Bible is the actual truths of God Himself.

And so we have the prophetic word confirmed, which you do well to heed as a light that shines in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts; knowing this first, that no prophecy of Scripture is of any private interpretation, for prophecy never came by the will of man, but holy men of God spoke as they were moved by the Holy Spirit.

## **HOW IS THE BIBLE ARRANGED?**

The Bible consists of 66 letters, historical accounts and additional writings that have been broken into 2 major sections: The Old Testament and The New Testament. The complete 66 books are referred to as the Canon of Scripture. There are 39 books in the Old Testament and 27 books in the New Testament.

The "Old Testament" was written primarily in the Hebrew language and is more correctly referred to as The Hebrew Scriptures. The Hebrew Scriptures contain 39 books of historical accounts, poetry, and prophecy. They contain the account of creation, God's dealings with man in general and God's dealings with a specific man (Abraham) and his descendants (the Jews) that God chose as His special people.

The "New Testament" was written in the Greek language and is commonly called The Greek Scriptures. The Greek Scriptures are the accounts of Jesus' life, death, resurrection and ascension into heaven as well as the establishing of His Church on earth. In addition, they contain letters, personal & corporate, with instruction on Christian living and doctrine (foundational teachings).

## ANNOTATIONS OF THE BIBLE

Each book of the Bible is broken into chapters and verses in order to simplify finding specific passages. When referring to a specific passage of scriptures the book name is given first followed by the chapter number and finally the verse(s). For example: John 3:16 would indicate the book of John, Chapter 3 and verse 16. At times, the book names are abbreviated such as Matt. for Matthew or 1 Cor. for First

Corinthians. Please consult the table of contents in the front of your Bible for additional abbreviations.

## TIPS FOR STUDYING YOUR BIBLE

- Pray for understanding and guidance before, during, and after you read your Bible.
- Read your Bible everyday in a systematic fashion (book by book not jumping around).
- Memorize the Table of Contents to assist you in locating Bible books rapidly.
- Think about what you are reading, especially the passages that make an impact on you.
- Underline or highlight important passages.
- Keep a dated journal to write down the thoughts and truths that God reveals to you.
- Ask yourself questions:
  - How can I apply this to myself or my life?
  - Is there a promise I can claim?
  - Is there an action I should take?
  - Is there a truth I can learn?
  - Is there an example I can follow?
  - Is there something I should pray about?

## **BELIEVE THE GOSPEL**

#### **BIBLE STUDY**

You may have heard the word "Gospel" before and never have known what it really meant. Perhaps you thought it referred merely to the first for books of the New Testament Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. Maybe you thought it meant "positively true", because you heard it used in a saying like this: "It's the gospel truth."

Actually, the word "Gospel" means "Good News" It is the good news about God's love for us, and the wonderful things He has done for us. Take out your Bible or New Testament, and we will see some of the great things it says about the Gospel.

Before we get into this study, I want to teach you something about studying your Bible. In the front of it, you will see a Table of Contents listing all the various books. Use this to find your way around the Bible until you become familiar with where they all are. Also, you will notice that notation is used something like this: Romans 1:16. It means: The book of Romans, Chapter One, verse sixteen. Become familiar with what these notations mean. Finally, pray for understanding whenever you read God's Word!

O.K. Let's start in and see what is said about the Gospel. Look up the Bible reference given, then write out the answer in your own words.

1. What does Romans 1:16 say that the Gospel is to everyone who

That's important, isn't it? Let's take a look at the Gospel in four steps.

#### STEP ONE - GOD'S LOVE

2. What is the one word in John 3:16 that describes why God sent His Son for you and me?

3. Look at John 10:10; why did Jesus come?		
STEP TWO – THE PROBLEM		
Sin is doing things our way instead of God's way. The Bible says that our sins have separated us from God.		
4. How many of us have sinned? (Romans 3:23)		
5. What is the result of this sin? (Romans 6:23)		
STEP THREE – THE SOLUTION		
God sent His Son, Jesus, to die for our sins, and to conquer its death by raising Him from the dead. This way we can come to God and receive all the good things He has for us.		
6. What did Christ go through to bring us to God? (1 Peter 3:18)		
7. True or False: God loved us an did this for us because we were so		
good that we deserved it. (Romans 5:8)		
8. Is being saved from sins something that I work for, or something God freely gives me? (Ephesians 2:8,9).		
9. Is there any other way to the Father except Jesus? (John 14:6)		

#### STEP FOUR - HOW IT WORKS

Now that we know what God has done, we need to receive the result into our lives.

10. How does one become a child of God? (John 1:12)

V D	What step are you on?  Oo you know that God loves you?  Will you admit that you have sinned?  Oo you realize that Jesus is the answer to your problems?  Have you received Him as the one who saves you?	

If you haven't received Him, you might want to do it in a prayer like this:

"Heavenly Father I confess that I am a sinner, and I thank You that You love me anyway. I believe that Jesus died and rose for me. I accept Him into my life. I turn from my way of doing things, to Your way, and give the control of my life to You. Thank you for this Good News."

**Did you receive Jesus?** If so, then God has forgiven you, made you his child, and come into you. He said that He would, and He never breaks His word.

12. Read 1 John 5: 11-12. Because you have received Jesus, God says that you now have something. What is it?

"That if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved." — **Romans 10:9**
